"Eclipse Viewing" - Brandon will be just outside the edge of totality. We will experience 99.4% coverage for approximately 3 minutes from 3:26-3:29 pm. The eclipse followers tell us that the added 0.6% does make a difference in the experience. To get totality, you can drive north for as little as 20 miles. Or a bit further north to be in the center of the path and experience totality that lasts longer.

If you do not wish to, or cannot travel, there are plenty of places where you can view in and around town, all with free parking. Some are listed here.

Be sure to use eclipse glasses, even if it is a cloudy day. You can get them free at Carr's gifts and at events. Stop in and pick a up pair; you will need them from 2:14 pm to 4:40 pm here in the Brandon area.

Estabrook Park 760 Grove Street – Brandon Recreation rec department will be hosting games for the kids. Restrooms , parking.

Neshobe Golf Club 224 Town Farm Road A great view can be had from the parking lot.

OR walk SW on the course, following Rt 73 back toward Brandon. Cross the river on the small, covered bridge and proceed up the hill to the back 9. There are spectacular western facing views and plenty of places to find your own private spot to watch.

Blueberry Hill Outdoor Center 1288 Goshen Ripton Rd.

Offering an extensive trail system, this Inn and outdoor center offers the best of both- a charming inn to visit, and trails thru the woods. Great Viewing can be had in the meadow around the outdoor center. Or the Hogback Mountain trail is an easy 2.8-mile loop with a gorgeous view (from a spur) at the halfway point of the Green Mountains, Brandon Gap, Taconic Ridge and the Adirondack. Maps are available on-site and online.

Moosalamoo National Recreation Area http://www.moosalamoo.org/

Moosalamoo (pronounced moose-ah-la-moo) is derived from the Abenaki word "Mozalômo" meaning "moose call, song or sound". Offering 70 miles of trails, including picnic areas, overlooks and accessible trails, you can experience the eclipse in backcountry splendor easily within reach of our quintessential Vermont town.

Branbury Beach State Park 3570 Lake Dunmore Rd, Salisbury, VT.

Located on the eastern shore of Lake Dunmore at the base of Mt. Moosalamoo. Historically, the 69-acre park operated as a farm at the turn of the century, then as a guest house, summer boy's camp and private beach and picnic area. In 1945, it became Branbury (Brandon-Salisbury) State Park. The 1000-foot natural sandy beach and the large open grassy areas make the area a perfect place to observe the eclipse over the 3-mile-long lake.

Silver Lake Salisbury, VT

Parking off of Rt 73 Just south of Bradbury Beach state park. A 3.2-mile round trip hike brings you to a beautiful hilltop lake with a sandy beach area, picnic and camping area with facilities (outhouse). This special spot is well worth the hike to enjoy the eclipse in a place once considered special by the Abnaki.

Downtown Brandon Brandon, Vermont

Grab a Coffee and sit in one of our parks or restaurant patios, or Sister Wicked's front porch and watch it get dark!
